



#### FAQs:

**Q:** Where is the complete Jobs Supported by State Exports List?

**Q:** Why isn't there jobs supported by Total (Goods and Services) State Exports detail?

**A:** Unavailability of services export data by state prevents the estimation of state-level jobs supported by services exports and total (goods and services) exports

**Q:** Can I add jobs supported by goods exports estimates from several states together to create a custom regional estimate?

**A:** Yes. For example, if I wanted to see how many jobs are supported by exports from New York and New Jersey, I would add 323,552 to 160,131 to come up with a total of 483,683 jobs that are supported by 2013 goods exports from New York and New Jersey combined. Out of an estimated 7.1 million jobs supported by goods exports from all 50 states combined, goods exports from both New York and New Jersey support about 6.8% of the national total.

**Q:** What does origin of movement mean and how does it impact these estimates?

**A:** The State Origin of Movement (OM) series is produced by the United States Census Bureau and generally provides export data based on the state from which the export began its journey to the port of export. However, in some cases, the origin of movement data does not reflect the state from which the export was initially transported. For example, when shipments are consolidated, the OM data will reflect the consolidation point of the shipment as opposed to the transportation origin.

**Q:** What is the difference between goods exports and manufactured exports?

**A:** Goods exports include manufactured products as well as other products like agricultural goods and natural resources commodities.
