



## Miami-Fort Lauderdale-Pompano Beach, FL

- In 2011, the Miami metropolitan area was the 5th largest export market in the United States, with merchandise shipments totaling \$43.1 billion. This is up \$7.3 billion (20.2 percent) from the \$35.9 billion in merchandise exported in 2010.
- The Miami metropolitan area accounted for 67.6 percent of Florida's merchandise exports in 2011.
- For the top 50 U.S. merchandise export destinations, Miami ranks among the major metropolitan area exporters to Venezuela (\$4.6 billion), Brazil (\$3.0 billion), Colombia (\$2.3 billion), the Dominican Republic (\$1.4 billion), and Panama (\$1.1 billion).
- Miami ranks among the major metropolitan area exporters of Computer and Electronic Products (\$10.2 billion), Transportation Equipment (\$5.8 billion), Machinery, Except Electrical (\$3.8 billion), Miscellaneous Manufactured Commodities (\$2.2 billion), and Food and Kindred Products (\$1.8 billion).
- In 2011, Miami benefited from existing trade agreements, exporting \$3.2 billion to the NAFTA region and \$4.6 billion to the CAFTA-DR region.
- 7.4 percent of Miami's merchandise exports go to NAFTA countries.
