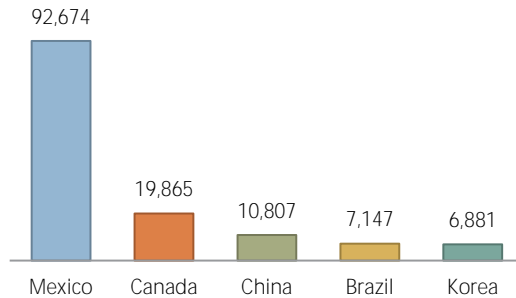
Texas Depends on World Markets

- Exports from Texas helped contribute to the \$2.21 trillion of U.S. goods and services exports in 2016.

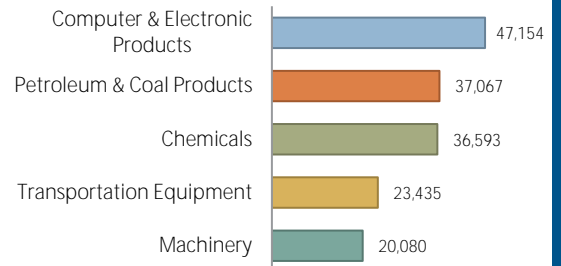

Texas's Top 5 Export Categories (Millions of U.S. Dollars)

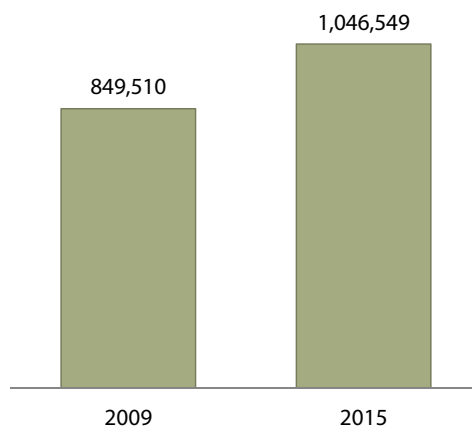


Exports Support Jobs

- Nationally, U.S. jobs supported by exports reached an estimated 11.5 million in 2015, up 1.9 million from 2009.

Exports Sustain Thousands of Texas Businesses

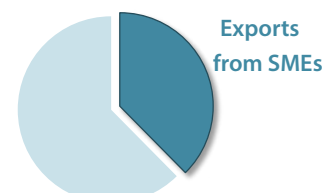
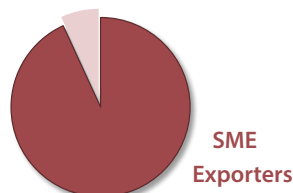
- A total of 41,881 companies exported from Texas locations in 2014.

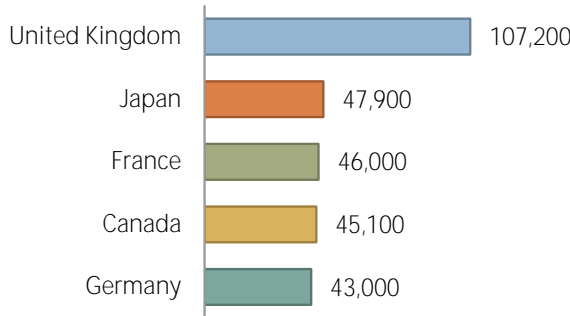

Number of Employees by Country of UBO



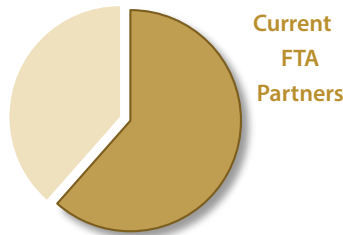

Free Trade Agreements

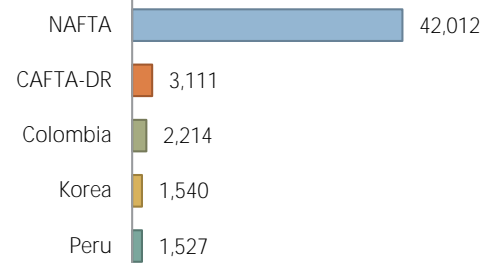
- The U.S. currently has 14 free trade agreements in force with 20 countries.
- Texas's exports to U.S. FTA partners totaled \$143.1 billion in 2016.

In 2016, exports to FTA markets accounted for **62%** of Texas exports



Since 2006, exports from Texas to FTA markets have grown by **60%**

Texas's Metropolitan Exports

- Houston-The Woodlands-Sugar Land is the 1st largest metro area reporting exports nationwide.
