FAST FACTS: UNITED STATES TRAVEL AND TOURISM INDUSTRY

Industry (2021; latest data available)

- 2.15% of GDP
- 7.4 million jobs
 - 4.8 million direct; 2.6 million indirect
 - 714 thousand total jobs supported by tourism exports
- \$1.7 trillion in total travel & tourism output
 - \$987.7 billion direct; \$716.3 billion indirect

International Trade (2022)

- \$165.5 billion international spending in U.S. (Exports)
- \$3.5 billion surplus
- Travel and tourism receipts: 18% of U.S. services exports
- Travel and tourism receipts: 5% of all U.S. exports


Market Share (2021)

- 5.5% share of world travelers/global arrivals
- The United States ranks 6th in terms of total arrivals behind France, Mexico, Spain, Turkey, and Italy, respectively
- The United States leads the world in global tourism receipts (exports), commanding a 11.0% share of world traveler spending in 2021*
- In fact, U.S. tourism exports totaled 43% more than the amount exported by our closest competitor (France)

U.S. Travel and Tourism-Related Exports (2022)


