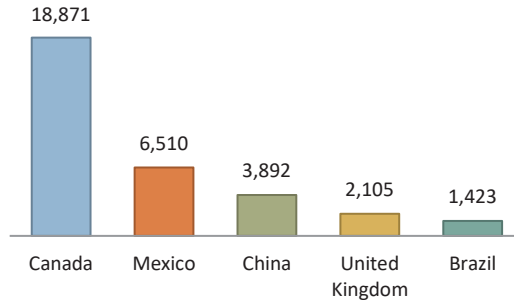

- Exports from Ohio helped contribute to the \$2.33 trillion of U.S. goods and services exports in 2017.

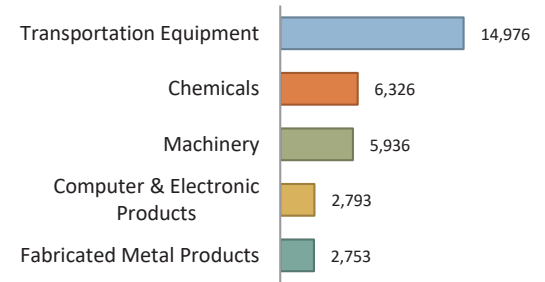

Ohio goods exports in 2017

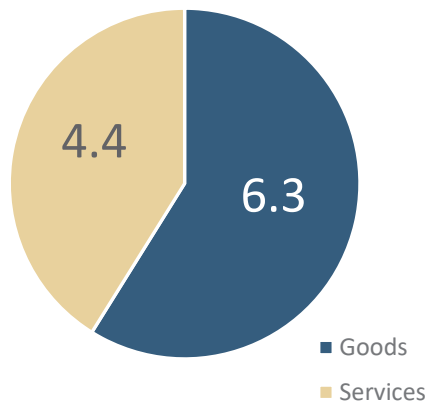
Ohio's Top 5 Export Categories

Exports Support Jobs

- Nationally, U.S. jobs supported by exports reached an estimated 10.7 million in 2016, up 1.2 million from 2006.

91% of these jobs were supported by manufactured goods exports

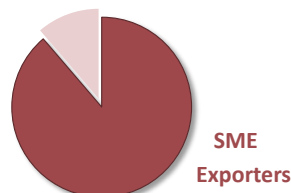
Exports Sustain Thousands of Ohio Businesses

- A total of 16,046 companies exported from Ohio locations in 2015.

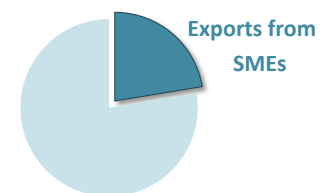

...and **22%** of known Ohio goods export value





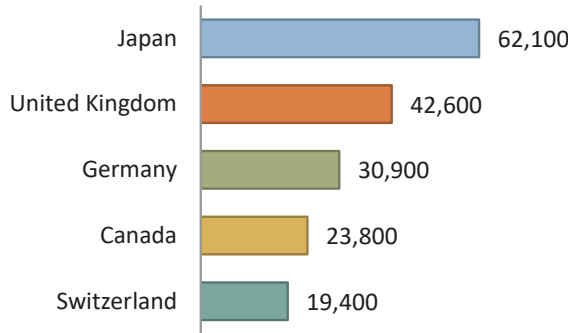

Number of Employees by Country of UBO



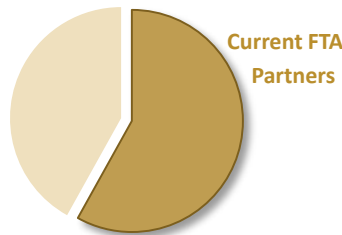

Free Trade Agreements

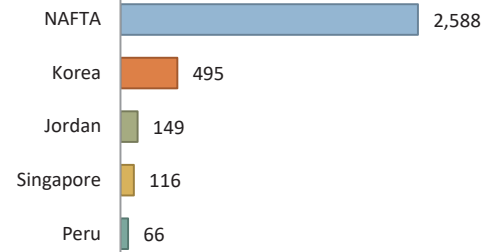
- The U.S. currently has 14 free trade agreements in force with 20 countries.
- Ohio's exports to U.S. FTA partners totaled \$29.1 billion in 2017.

In 2017, exports to FTA markets accounted for **58%** of Ohio exports

Ohio's Metropolitan Exports

- Cincinnati is the 11th largest metro area reporting exports nationwide.
