Commerce Initiates Antidumping and Countervailing Duty Investigations of Aluminum Lithographic Printing Plates from the People's Republic of China and Japan

On October 19, 2023, the U.S. Department of Commerce (Commerce) announced the initiation of antidumping duty (AD) investigations of aluminum lithographic printing plates (printing plates) from the People's Republic of China (China) and Japan and a countervailing duty (CVD) investigation of printing plates from China.

While the import statistics provided in a petition and in E&C's Factsheet typically reflect imports for consumption, the import statistics provided in the printing plates petitions and provided in the above table reflect general imports. In the petitions, the petitioner notes that imports for consumption include printing plates produced by the petitioner in, and subsequently withdrawn from, its Foreign Trade Zone (FTZ) facility; therefore, the petitioner states that general imports, which do not reflect merchandise withdrawn from an FTZ, provide an accurate and comprehensive basis for evaluating imports from China and Japan. Imports of printing plates enter under an HTSUS subheading that may cover subject and non-subject merchandise. Therefore, publicly available import data may not accurately reflect actual imports of printing plates covered by the scope of the investigations.
