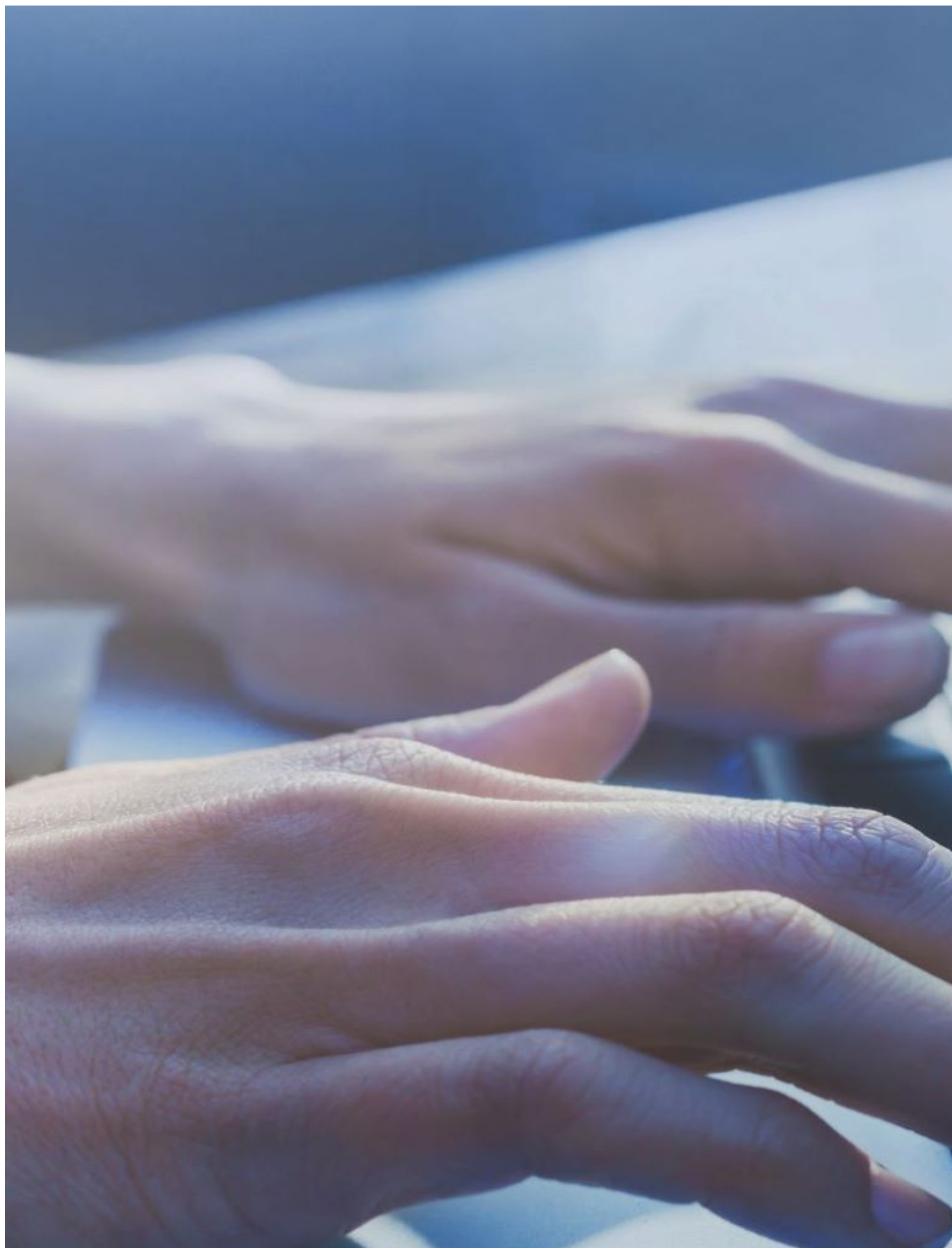




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# Final Determinations in the ADCVD Investigations of Mattresses from Multiple Trading Partners

## Final Determinations in the Antidumping (AD) Investigations of Mattresses from India, Kosovo, Mexico, and Spain and Countervailing Duty (CVD) Investigations of Mattresses from Indonesia

On July 16, 2024, the U.S. Department of Commerce (Commerce) announced the final affirmative determinations in the antidumping duty (AD) investigations of mattresses from India, Kosovo, Mexico, and Spain and the final negative determination in the countervailing duty (CVD) investigation of mattresses from Indonesia.
