Preliminary Affirmative Determinations in the Countervailing Duty Investigations of 2,4-Dichlorophenoxyacetic Acid from the People's Republic of China and India

On September 10, 2024, the U.S. Department of Commerce (Commerce) announced the preliminary determinations of the countervailing duty (CVD) investigations of 2,4-Dichlorophenoxyacetic Acid (2,4-D) from the People's Republic of China (China) and India. Commerce is currently conducting antidumping duty (AD) investigations of 2,4-D from China and India.
