## Commerce Initiates Antidumping and Countervailing Duty Investigations of Thermoformed Molded Fiber Products from the People's Republic of China and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam

On October 29, 2024, the U.S. Department of Commerce (Commerce) announced the initiation of antidumping duty (AD) investigations and countervailing duty (CVD) investigations of thermoformed molded fiber products from the People's Republic of China (China) and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam (Vietnam).
