Industry Support

In order to initiate an investigation, the Department of Commerce (Commerce) must determine that a petition is filed on behalf of and has the support of the industry producing the domestic like product in the United States ("**industry support**").

Commerce will determine that the petition has sufficient **industry support** if it meets two criteria: the "25% Test" and the "50% Test".

Key Elements of Industry Support:

• "25% Test": The domestic producers or workers who support the petition must account for at least 25% of the total production of the domestic like product.

The ratio for the "25% Test" is derived by:

• "50% Test": The domestic producers or workers who support the petition must account for more than 50% of the production of the domestic like product produced by that portion of the industry expressing support for or opposition to the petition.

The ratio for the "50% Test" is derived by:

Important Considerations:

- The petition must identify all known producers of the domestic like product along with their contact information.
- The petition must include information relating to the degree of industry support for the petition, including:
 - 1. the total volume of U.S. production of the domestic like product, and
 - 2. the volume of U.S. production of the domestic like product produced by each petitioner and each domestic producer identified.
- Typically, production information should be provided for the most recently completed calendar year.
- If the domestic producers or workers who support the petition do not account for at least 50% of total U.S. production, Commerce must poll the industry to determine its views on the petition or rely on other available information to determine industry support.
