**Regulatory Cooperation Statement:** Since 2014, Natural Resources Canada (NRCan) and the U.S. Department of Energy (U.S. DOE) have worked together to align new and updated energy efficiency standards and test methods for energy-using consumer products and equipment. Per stakeholder request, we are now evaluating whether alignment and/or consolidation of information collection is viable under our respective statutory schemes in order to reduce paperwork burden and streamline the collection of information related to compliance with U.S. and Canadian energy efficiency/energy conservation standards for specific appliances.
