THE TOKYO DECLARATION ON THE U.S.-JAPAN GLOBAL PARTNERSHIP [Bush Tokyo Visi Tex ]

January 9, 1992

The Presiden of he Uni ed S a es of America and he Prime Minis er of Japan declare:

### **PREAMBLE**

From ragic conflic fif y years ago, Japan and he Uni ed S a es have developed a highly produc ive and mu ually beneficial rela ionship of close poli ical, securi y, economic, scien ific, and cul ural coopera ion. The wo coun ries are now highly in erdependen a all levels of heir socie ies. They base heir coopera ion on shared principles of poli ical and economic freedom, democracy, he rule of law, and respec for human righ s.

The wo coun ries recognize ha his coopera ion made an impor an con ribu ion o wea hering he chill of he Cold War era and in promo ing four decades of global s abili y and prosperi y.

The wo governmen s recognize ha oday, in he pos Cold War era, rtew poli ical and economic challenges confron he U.S. Japan rela ionship. Economic issues have assumed new prominence. To ensure ha he U.S. and Japan fully exploi oppor uni ies for coopera ion, bo h coun ries place he highes priori y on aking effec ive measures o address fac ors underlying economic fric ion, wi h a focus on issues in heir rading and inves men rela ions.

Japan and he Uni ed S a es recognize he benefi s o heir socie ies of he close coopera ion hey have enjoyed in he pos war period and are commiged to building on his foundation to create an even closer par nership. Bo h acknowledge ha a closer rela ionship mus be cons ruc ed on enhanced mu ual unders anding and shared in eres s. As he wo larges marke orien ed economies and democracies in he world, Japan and he Uni ed S a es accep a special responsibili y for shaping he new era.

The wo governmen s herefore resolve o join in a Global Par nership based on hese enduring values o help build a jus, peaceful and prosperous world and o mee he challenges or he wen y firs cen ury.

To achieve hese goals, he wo coun ries will coopera e o s reng hen he GATT mul ila eral rading sys em; reinvigora e he U.N. organiza ion; advance arms con rol and he non-prolifera ion of weapons of mass des ruc ion; assis he-developing world o promo e grow h and s abili y; and pro ec and improve he global environmen . The Uni ed S a es and Japan recommi heir resources and he alen s of heir peoples o he purposes of he Uni ed Na ions Char er.

As na ions of he Asia-Pacific region, he Uni ed S a es and Japan are commi ed o promo ing prosperi y, reducing ensions, and enhancing poli ical coopera ion in he region and o ake s eps o s reng hen he bonds of he Asia-Pacific communi y while respec ing i s diversi y. To his end, Japan and he Uni ed S a es recognize he Asia-Pacific Economic Coopera ion (APEC) framework as he forum for enhanced regional effor s o promo e open marke s, sus ain dynamic economic grow h, and build poli ical coopera ion.

Japan and he Uni ed S a es will also broaden he scope of heir coopera ion in he res of he world, including he Middle Eas, Cen ral and Sou h America, Africa, and Europe, wilh par icular a en ion o suppor ing coun ries hat are in transitint e ra an  $^{ma}$ rket e n  $^{mi}$ es.
